3/10/2010	Mouth of Arch Canyon to first water crossing, road not passable beyond first crossing due to flooding. No OHV disturbances noted.	John Bartolomucci
4/5/2010	Mouth of Arch Canyon up to the first mile of the canyon. Canyon still in flood condition. No OHV disturbances noted.	John and Janet Bartolomucci
4/26/2010	8.5 miles from the mouth of Arch Canyon to US Forest Service boundary. BLM employee worked with San Juan County and local OHV group SPEAR to remove a rock slide blocking the Arch Canyon route at approximately mile 6. The rock slide was causing motorized users to find an alternative route which was causing rutting on the adjacent hillside. The alternative route was repaired and disguised to discourage any future travel. Two other locations in the canyon showed signs of minor damage caused by ATVs leaving the designated route. This damage was mitigated by raking out the ATV tracks.	Todd Parker
4/30/2010	Mouth of Arch Canyon to first water crossing. Monitoring on Jeep Jamboree Special Recreation Permit. No violation of stipulations and no other canyon users were observed. No OHV disturbances noted.	Brian Quigley
5/5/2010	Patrols completed up the four miles of Arch Canyon on April 23, 24 and May 5. Existing closure of a side undesignated spur route was noted and documented. Closed route had been driven on. One additional side route leading to a cultural site was documented. Existing route closure was improved and the second undesignated route was closed later by Youth Conservation Corps.	Laird Naylor

One infraction included a full size vehicle pulling off trail to make a three point turn. Mitigation of all three areas included raking out the vehicle tracks.
